REPORT from CHAIR ON CHILTERN LEAGUE 2022 - 2023

Last winter proved to be another successful year for the Chiltern League. We received good appreciations for our venues and organisation from competitors. I am sure they understand that a few people give them the opportunity to have a good variety of courses.

We are indebted to Oxford City A.C., Bedford and County, Luton A.C. plus Marshall Milton Keynes and Leighton Buzzard A.C. who work together for their two fixtures. You all do a good organisation of your events for the league and are to be congratulated on your endeavours. You have become regular venues in recent years and we appreciate your continuing volunteering efforts. The league would like more venues so that we can rotate the fixtures. If any club or a combination of clubs could find venue/s with sufficient parking nearby, we would appreciate a new challenge.

The introduction of all clubs needing to provide marshals at one event as their contribution to successful racing has been helpful. Knowing in advance your venue has enabled clubs to be better prepared to organise their members.

Fiona Turner offered to help with the awards a couple of years ago but has since proved to be an excellent secretary and communicator. Clubs should be aware that they need to keep Fiona updated of any contact, email or phone number changes so that she can contact you effectively. Fiona , and Paul her partner, sorted all the awards for presentation at Keysoe and I hope all clubs appreciated how smoothly this went. As a reminder all clubs should have at least one member present at the presentations so that Fiona does not have to spend time with the uncollected awards. As we do not post them you probably won't get any owing until seven months later! Fiona was able to advise those of you who needed extra medals effectively what to do.

Richard Inchley has been the treasurer for thirty plus years and his excellent knowledge of the financial needs has enabled him over the years to adapt to financial changes / demands as they have arisen. We always cover venue costs so that the promoting clubs are not financially deprived. Richard's scaling of the membership fees so that larger clubs pay more has benefited all clubs by making costs more equal. This has helped the smaller clubs by moving away from the " same payment suits all "which used to be the case. Even with this scaling the cost of an athlete competing in the five races is a small amount compared to prices that are now charged to enter road races.

Mick Bromilow , our results go to person, does an amazing job getting out the results within a few hours with basically no mistakes. This is down to clubs entering their competitors' details correctly. However, if you know of a mistake you have made either with the wrong number being worn, wrong age group, etc it is important that you let Mick know quickly so that corrections can be made. Mick is an expert at solving problems and appreciates how club administrations have improved.

Mick and Richard are our venue negotiators and are appreciative of all the help promoting clubs accept to make their planning successful. The league commends the time taken by clubs in planning the day with the various courses being marked and the marshalling.

The League is appreciative of the many hours Fiona, Mick and Richard dedicate to the league. They hope as a result you all enjoy your races.

Last year we only had three cups / shields at the presentations. There used to be eight to ten. If any club or any past member has one of these, we would appreciate its return so that they can be engraved for the years missed and awarded. They must be somewhere!

May you enjoy your league races in 2023 – 24.

Treasurer's Report

The season 2022/2023 saw us host fixtures at five venues at a cost of £8553.90. Also included in fixture costs is the bill of £900 from MMKAC from the previous season.

You may recall that the cost of numbers from the previous season had not been invoiced so this is another cost brought forward relating to the previous season and this was £756.00.

The cost of trophies and medals was £1354.50 an increase of £80 on last year, website hosting was £60 and the League portal and updates cost us £574.85, with running numbers again £756.

Our total expenditure including the items not charged in the previous year was £12955.25 and this was set against income of £11467.41. This income included £150 from the previous season, £617 for guest fees and lost numbers (an increase of £360) and subscriptions of £10,700.00 which was £1000 less than 2021/22.

This has resulted in a deficit for the year of £1487.84, but if we amalgamate this with last year we have a net surplus of £2360.25, over the last two years.

Our cash at bank now stands at £6292.36.

However, with these reserves carried forward, and despite expenses expected to be roughly 10% higher resulting in a small projected loss for next season, I see no reason to propose an increase in the subscription scale, so will not be doing so.

There will be some clubs, who by virtue of their numbers competing last year will have a different subscription.
