3. REPORT FROM CHAIR – CHILTERN LEAGUE – 2023 / 2024

Another successful year has been accomplished by the League.

We are indebted once again to the continuing loyalty of Bedford County A.C. (Keysoe Equestrian Centre), Marshall Milton Keynes and Leighton Buzzard A.C. (Teardrop Lakes) Luton A.C. (Stopsley) and Oxford A.C. (Horspath) who work diligently each year to enable us to enjoy the courses and atmosphere they create.

It was good to welcome back Watford Harriers offer of Cassiobury Park and its surroundings after a ten year absence. It would have been a challenge re-inventing the race routes and structures but you did excellently.

To all five venues a huge thank you for your support and hopefully we can have more races with you in the coming years.

Years ago, there were ten venues – five in each division and only rarely did we meet up for one fixture a year where we raced together like we now do all the time. Each division had no Under 11 races then and only about 200 to 250 contested each fixture. We lost venues because, despite our pleas, athletes parked irresponsibly. Hence our current structure of five venues for the joint divisions racing has been "forced on us" in many ways by the need for ample parking. We wonder if there are any more venues that could be explored to offer a bigger variety in the future. Could two clubs work together if a new venue could become a possibility? Once a venue is lost it is almost impossible to retrieve it and the demands by the authorities seem to apply more restrictions to applications. We need to persevere and promote our needs.

I wonder if athletes actually know how much time is spent on their behalf by a few willing people volunteering many hours to enable them to enjoy their racing challenges. I am sure they have no idea of the costs and documentation involved. We may have to in time split to separate venues if parking becomes an issue.

We are indebted again to Richard Inchley (Treasurer, Fixture & Officials Coordinator), Fiona Turner (Secretary & Trophies), Mick Bromilow (Results for the first three fixtures) and Andy and Amy Inchley along with Richard Inchley & Richard Pownall who produced the last two fixtures' results.

We must recognise the extra work which Fiona undertook to sort and post out the awards won by individuals and clubs after the Oxford fixture as we were unable to present them on the day. Frustratingly some clubs were slow to respond to her requests – it is important club details are correct and that the responses asked for are replied to quickly.

To the many officials and marshals who may have helped at one fixture or all five — THANK YOU. Without you there would be no races. Your commitment to the hours required and in all weathers is to be commended. You are in many ways more important than the athletes but not enough of them say a "thank you" after they have raced.

There are challenges ahead. Most of the dedicated committee who have served the League for many years are not seeking re-election but will guide the new post holders as they plan

for the 2024 - 25 season. This planning will need to start soon so that we are ready for the first fixture scheduled for the 12th October, 2024.

Thank you to all the clubs who support the league which started in 1959 and has grown to its current size of over 1000 racers at each fixture. The Chiltern League has been recognised as being one of the most efficient in the country.

I wish you all good racing in 2024 – 25.

5. FINANCES & ACCOUNTS

Treasurer's Report

You will recall from last year that there was no increase in subscriptions as we had reserves in excess of £6000. You will see from last season's activities, on the Receipts and Payments Account, we had a deficit of £3996.35 leaving us with cash reserves of £2296.01 at the end of May 2024.

The cost of hosting fixtures has risen considerably, with large increases in venue costs, first aid and portable toilets, with our five venues costing 30% more than the previous year. The League now has to pay an Affiliation Fee to England Athletics, and this year the accounts has two years included as the fee is due by 30th April. The fee for last year (when it was introduced in September, was £150 but has now increased to £200 for 2024/2025. We purchased two stopwatches for the results team (£75), and trophies and medals increased by £74 to £1428.

The cost of professional updating the database decreased by just under £50 and we reduced the barcoded numbers ordered slightly saving a further £65.

Guest fees decreased this year, mostly due to the absence of the Oxford University v RAF match, which has been included in the Teardrop Lakes fixture in recent years.

We managed to have a small surplus from the "extra medal scheme" that were ordered, thank you all for your help with this, and also to Fiona who spent hours packing them all up and posting them out to you. Hopefully next season we will be in a position to present medals at the last fixture.

I am delighted that we have been able to commission a new website for £700, which we hope you will find both useful and user friendly, it is certainly an improvement on the very outdated version that went before, and we encourage you to refer to it regularly.

With the increase in fixture costs of 30%, I am proposing that the fee scale increase by 30%. This will not always mean an increase to every Club of that amount, as some Clubs will change their band as well depending on last year's participation, some will increase more than 30% and some may even pay less than last year if their participation levels have reduced.

The document showing the new subscription level proposed also for your guidance breaks the cost down per athlete per race, which you will see is very reasonable even for those with lower participation numbers.

If approved, the income of nearly £14,000, should cover our costs next season, but no more, so I suspect that there will be a further increase next year, to ensure the financial stability of the League.

We are indebted to several brilliant amateur and professional photographers who have provided images free of charge.

Going forward, we hope to have a Social Media / Website Co-ordinator who will take responsibility for updating the website to include adding results, updating details of fixtures and other content changes. Training will be provided and there will be ongoing technical support provided by Pink Desk Studio.

7. THE FUTURE OF THE CHILTERN LEAGUE

Some Thoughts from Bill - Chair

Is there a future?

The Chiltern Cross Country League started in 1959 as a small gathering of clubs to provide a league structure of competition over five races rather that a one off event which was common at that time. The challenge was to provide these fixtures to reward individual and teams for their achievements and commitments.

Richard Inchley and I joined the league around forty years ago when Roger Kraushar of Old Gaytonians (now Harrow Athletic Club) asked for help. Roger seemed to be doing all the administration and liaising with clubs hosting fixtures. I ended up doing the results for one division and Roger the other using pen and paper. We were as good as computers as we could produce results that evening so that they were in the Sunday papers a few hours later. Richard took over the accounts as the cash needed to cover expenses was increasing.

The three of us maintained our happy system but when Roger became ill and died, Denis Orme of Old Gaytonians (Harrow Athletic Club) took on the league results Roger was doing while Richard and I maintained our positions. During this time computers began to appear and gradually Denis took over doing all the results when both leagues joined together to the system we now have. There were a few "fun results" at times but Denis eventually mastered the requirements to provide better results a few days later. As time progressed Denis became efficient at getting the results out quicker. When Denis became ill with cancer, Mick Bromilow of Marshall Milton Keynes stepped in to help and with improving computer equipment has produced results within a day or quicker. In recent years we have introduced chip numbers, bar codes, the same number for a runner for the season, and clubs doing their entries on line to improve our efficiency. Everybody seems grateful for these improvements.

Our reputation for efficiency grew and clubs kept asking to join. We now needed secretarial help and over the years have had four wonderful ladies who have streamlined our communications greatly. The ladies who left were excellent - but having all received promotions at work, all expressed sadness that they did not have the time needed to do the position justice. Five years ago, Fiona Turner (St Albans Athletic Club) responded to our call for help and has been a wonderful asset with her organisation and has quickly responded to club queries and any information which clubs needed to know.

Throughout all this time, Richard has been treasurer. He has supported clubs with their financial requests, was the main contact for the many United Kingdom Challenge races that were included in our Teardrop Lakes fixtures and paid any costs required to make venues more effective. Richard's care for club finances resulted in his organising a fairer system of club payments depending on club competing numbers. As a result, the cost to clubs for their athletes to compete is low compared to road and track events. Careful spending has enabled

a better balance to be carried forward to enable necessary payments to be made before clubs are required to pay the new winters affiliation fees.

Now we are at a challenging point.

The results position is already vacant.

Fiona Turner as secretary is not seeking re-election.

Richard Inchley as treasurer, fixture & officials coordinator is not seeking re-election.

They will actively support during a handover period but will not continue to perform their roles beyond the AGM.

As for me – clubs will decide at the Annual Meeting if they still want me or wish for a total change after forty years.

The Future Has To Be Different:

Four people have maintained the organisation of forty clubs and now over a thousand athletes at each fixture in recent years. We have willingly spent countless hours for the benefit of many thousands of competitors but we must look to the future for the League to survive and flourish. Never again must it be just FOUR WILLING VOLUNTEERS.

FINALLY: The league functions as SEPARATE male and female races across all age groups. The permits are obtained as such.

We operate under UKA Rules and Code of Conduct.

EVERY RACE is a CHAMPIONSHIP RACE in every age group with the cumulative individual and team awards being recognised after the fifth fixture.

8. PROPOSAL & APPOINTMENT OF ORGANISING TEAM

A small group of long-term Chiltern League club representatives and officials kindly agreed to meet with the committee in April, to try and map out what roles and responsibilities will need to be filled if the League is to continue next season.

There are nine roles identified as critical – i.e., unless these jobs are done – there will be no league events next season.

It is not essential for all the people in these roles to sit on the Committee – that could be optional, however the committee has only ever met once or twice a year and recently this has been remotely. Given the transition to a new team, it may require a few initial online meetings this year. To be clear the roles don't require people to sit in endless meetings!

Where there is a nominee, this is indicated, but if others are interested in performing these roles please do come forward. There are 6 roles with no nominee.

Could all clubs who wish the league to continue, discuss this with their members and consider if you have a member or parent who could potentially cover one of these roles.

If the roles cannot be filled but clubs do wish the league to continue, we suggest they are allocated to clubs – maybe on an annual rotation basis – starting with the largest participating clubs, filling one role each. This could start with largest clubs who have not hosted a fixture in the recent past being allocated a role first, and then proceed in order of participation. Given it would just be an annual commitment – and for a smaller defined area, these could be less daunting and easier to enlist support. But all ideas welcome!

Please note the role job descriptions are based on how the league has been currently run. The current committee's recommendation is to initially assume the same known viable methods and processes for at least the start of the 2024-25 season. The new team, in due course may wish to consider different methods e.g., chip timing or an app based results system, outsourcing more roles, open races, split division fixtures, etc. Many of these will require investment or consultation – so will need fully costed proposals and consideration by all member clubs. Hence at this AGM we do not plan to discuss different methods of operating – we don't have the time or people to cost and consider alternative proposals and won't be here to follow through on their delivery.

Ideally, we don't advise combining of roles - as we have tried to make the roles less onerous and more manageable – given we understand many will be doing these alongside other roles within their club. Secondly, we feel it is important that the league is organised by a broader cross section of the member clubs and not as dependant on the experience, knowledge and well-being on a very small number of people. We encourage clubs to look to their younger adult members to fulfil these roles – especially as they can largely be completed remotely and around running at matches.

Key Roles to be Filled for League to Continue

1. Fixture Coordinator - Vacant

- Liaison with potential host clubs to agree five venues and a match calendar.
- Advise host clubs of league match requirements and support as needed.
- Encourage clubs to consider new venues or revisit past venues.
- Generate club marshalling rota for agreed fixtures and ensure delivered

2. Treasurer (nominee: Richard Hart Oxford City AC)

- Manage budgeting & finances of the league.
- Produce annual budget and accounts
- Proposing club subscriptions, invoicing and collection
- Processing payment to host clubs & officials for cost of venues & match expenses
- Processing payments to suppliers for annual costs of running the league
- Provide League advice regarding new capital expenditure and or outsourcing

3. Officials Coordinator - Vacant

- Agree a team of officials for each fixture that meets UKA & host requirements
- Budget & receive officials' expenses and pass to Treasurer
 Including a Match Referee (min. L4 for senior races / where field is >200), Starter,
 Line Judges x 2, then dependent on agreed placing & timing results process

4. Registration Coordinator - Vacant

- Define process for team and individual registration (Initially CL Portal)
- Coordinate with external supplier for annual updating of portal
- Retain Team Manager login details and aid team managers as needed with Portal
- Organise printing of race numbers and allocation of these across clubs & divisions
- Hold unallocated numbers and supply these to team managers / clubs at matches
- Record replacement numbers, payment & manage these on the portal as required
- Manage guest registration allocation of numbers, online pre-payment & numbers

5. Results Coordinator (nominee Richard Pownall MMK)

- Define process for recording place and timing at each match & scoring system (initially based on existing equipment & processes)
- Coordinate people & systems for recording of results at each match
- Produce individual & team results by race, by division by match & season to date
- Publish provisional & final results, resolve any queries

6. **Secretary - Vacant**

- Maintain team manager & other club contacts database
- Oversee all communication to Clubs in the league
- Coordinate AGM agenda, support documentation & produce minutes
- Manage all central files of information to be shared with the organising team
- Write to Clubs prior to each season with pre-race preparation, each fixture, & AGM

7. Awards Coordinator (nominee Chiltern Harriers Tom Team)

- Select a supplier and order medals & trophies once per season
- Receive & check / pre-sort all awards to aid presentation
- Organise presentation and/or dispatch of all awards to clubs
- Provide support for clubs to order more awards inc. dispatch centres

8. Social Media & Website Coordinator (nominee Katie Royals Chiltern Harriers)

- Oversee social media & website presence to ensure safe and appropriate content
- Update social media sites & website with news, fixture details & results
- Coordinate suppliers for maintenance of website, team email addresses etc.
- Support team communications to ensure data protection & effective methods

9. Chairperson (nominee Bill O'Connor QPH)

- Coordinate the organising team
- Act as a spokesperson for the league & liaise with UKA & England Athletics
- Chair AGM & ad-hoc team meetings
- Arbitrate on issues or key decisions

9. 2024 - 2025 SEASON PLAN

9a) Potential Fixtures for 2024-25 Season

Equally important in securing the future of the league is to have potential venues and host clubs! Currently we have **no confirmed fixtures for next season.** We only have the proposed target dates as issues by England Athletics which are:

Saturday 12th October 2024 Saturday 9th November 2024 Saturday 30th November 2024 Saturday 11th January 2025 Saturday 8th February 2025

We need all clubs to consider potential venues and if they could join forces with other clubs to host a fixture. This is essential as we cannot continue to rely on the same 5/6 clubs hosting. Several of the venues have become tricky and have a high chance of becoming unfeasible.

There may be a possibility of the following clubs and venues being able to consider again hosting a fixture, but we must not assume all will be feasible.

Bedford & County AC at Keysoe when compatible with building works & cost dependent Oxford City AC at Horspath – of no Football / event clash and ground conditions OK - dry Leighton Buzzard AC & MMK at Teardrop Lakes Milton Keynes Luton AC at Stopsley Common if no Football Match clash Watford Harriers at Cassiobury Park – if no Football or Golf clash & if guaranteed significant set up & marshalling assistance from nearby clubs or full co-host club!

9b) Marshalling Rota

As per previous seasons, all member clubs who do not host a fixture within the season are required to supply course marshals for the entire match day. This can be made up of a rota of marshals with overlapping time slots – so they are able to be at the agreed marshalling post to take over. This should also allow your marshals to also run or watch their children run.

Larger clubs who last season had 100 or more attendees during the previous season, need to cover at least two marshal slots for the match day and those with 250 or more attend, three marshalling slots for the match day.

Clubs will be assigned fixtures to provide marshal once the venues are confirmed.
